

## Admittance to nature

Respect private property. There is no public access to private properties, neither with or without buildings whatever it is indicated by a sign or not.

According to the law you may take a walk in private forests and on uncultivated areas without a fence. In the forests you may only follow the paths and constructed roads and only between 07 a.m. and sunset. You must also respect a distance of 150 m from any building.

Admittance is always on your own responsibility – and dogs are only allowed on a lead.

## Fire precaution

Be very cautious about open fire and smoking. It might be very dry everywhere, on areas covered by grass and in the plantations.

According to the law it is not allowed to make an open fire or do any other thing, which might cause a conflagration. Incautiousness can lead to a disaster and both human beings and animals will be in danger.

Foresight is important! Find out where fire beaters and fire hoses are placed and also how to get access to the nearest telephone! A conflagration very often starts as a small fire which only a small amount of water e.g. from a garden hose or a pail can extinguish.

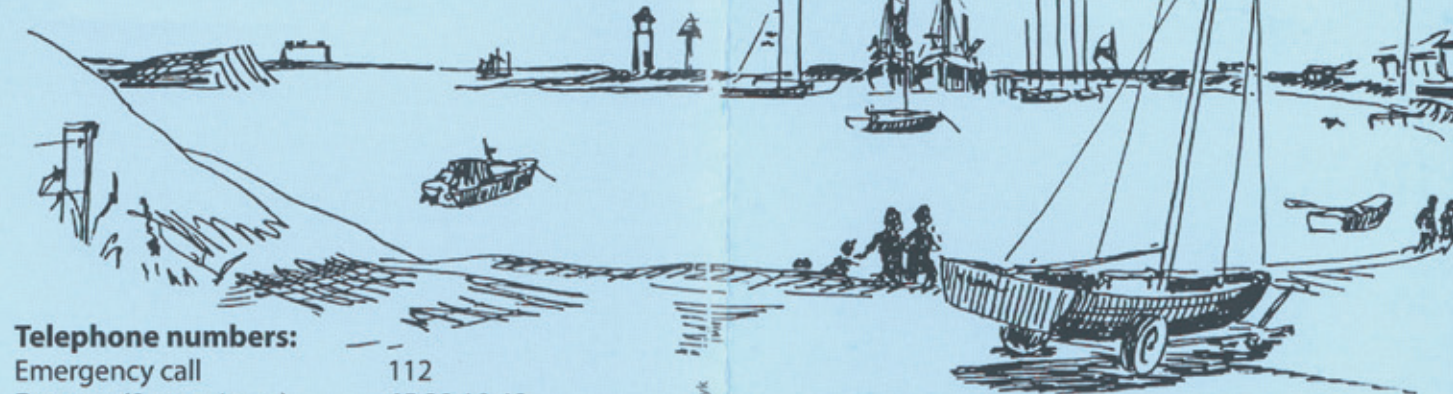

# Good rules of conduct

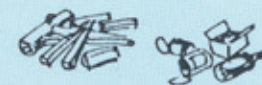
In general: avoid unnecessary noise!

Do not play loud music in open air or with your windows open. And don't use motorized garden tools on Saturday and Sunday evening.

Do not trample new paths and do not cross fences and earthworks.

Please only use the existing paths and passages.

It is not allowed to use private property or their entrances as short cuts. Neither is it allowed to collect firewood from or throw garbage on the private property.



Pay attention to the animals, which live everywhere at Fyns Hoved. Especially be careful during the breeding season and on places where it could be foreseen that they might eat and rest.

Never touch young animals even if they seem to be left by their parents.



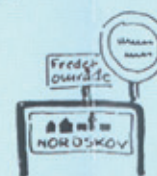
The owners of property, that borders on to private common roads, have the responsibility of removing or prune both plantation and weed on the roads.

**All brushwood has to be removed** on the grounds of fire risk.



You may take your dog out on the carriage roads in the area, but dogs are only allowed on a lead. Remember to collect its excrements. Also remember to throw the plastic bag into the garbage bag at your residence!

Respect the signs. They are not there to bother anyone, but to avoid accidents or damage and to protect the privacy.



Respect the speed limits on public roads and drive slowly – **not more than 20 km/h** on all private roads in the area. The Association of property owners at Fyns Hoved makes repair of the roads two times a year. The vegetation is tight and children and animals might show up without warning. Even 30 km an hour might be too fast – so please reduce the speed!

Economize the water, it is an important resource – and very expensive!
